Directions to the WARREN & DIUG CAMPGRIUND

Go North on I-5 to CA-99 at Grapevine.

North on CA-99 towards Bakersfield for 97 miles. Take exit 96 to go east on CA-198 for 6.3 miles.

Take exit 107A towards CA-63 for 0.3 miles.

Turn left on CA-63 heading north. This is a one way street. If cars are swerving around you and honking, you turned too soon and are going the wrong way on a one way street.

Continue North on CA-63 for 21 miles.

Turn left to stay on CA-63, go about 1 mile, then turn right to stay on CA-63.

Continue North on CA-63 for another 8.5 miles.

Turn right on CA-180 and go east for 25 miles.

Turn left and circle through the toll booths paying your toll.

Turn right at Generals Highway.

Head east on Generals Highway 3.6 miles to Ten Mile Road.

Turn left on Ten Mile Road.


Go North on Ten Mile Road for, you guessed it, 10 miles.

You will see Hume Lake on your right.

Turn left on Aspen Hollow Road. If you get to Hume Lake Christian Camp, you went a little bit too far.
